- The sensor may be burned out by a laser beam, so when any laser equipment is in using, make sure that the surface of sensor will not be exposed to the laser beam.
- Do not place the camera in extremely hot, cold (the operating temperature shall be  $-30^{\circ}\text{C} \sim +60^{\circ}\text{C}$ , or  $-40^{\circ}\text{C} \sim +60^{\circ}\text{C}$  if the camera model has an “H” in its suffix), dusty or damp locations, and do not expose it to high electromagnetic radiation.

- To avoid heat accumulation, good ventilation is required for operating environment.
- Keep the camera away from liquid while in use.
- While in delivery, the camera shall be packed in its original packing, or packing of the same texture.

# 1 Appearance Description

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The camera series has two appearance types:

Type I: Non-IK10 Camera

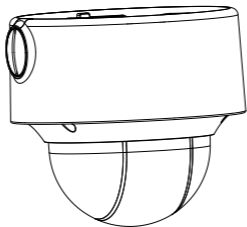


Figure 1-1 Type I Camera

Type II: IK10 Camera

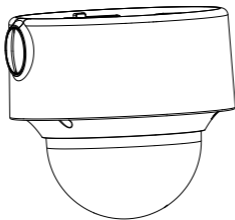


Figure 1-2 Type II Camera

## 1.1 Components

Two appearance types share similar structure except for the bubble.

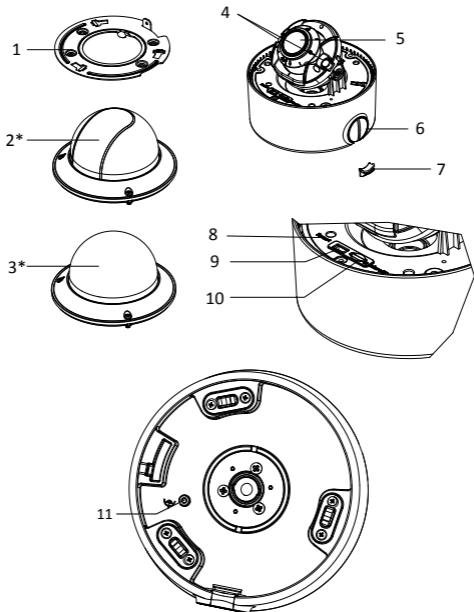


Figure 1-3 Camera Components

**Note:**

Press RESET for about 10s when the camera is powering on or rebooting to restore the default settings, including the user name, password, IP address, port No., etc.

## 1.2 Cables

This camera series has several camera models, each of which may have different cable group. The following figures and tables show the description of possible cables in this camera series.

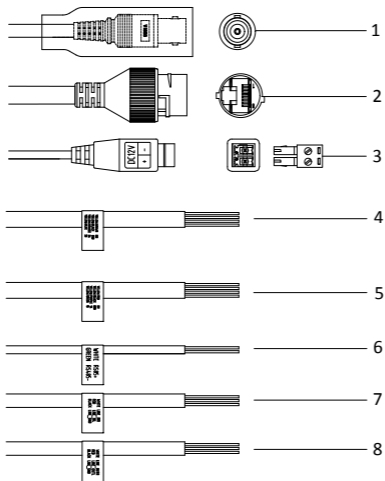


Figure 1-4 Overview of Cables

## 2 Installation

---

### *Before you start:*

- Make sure the device in the package is in good condition and all the assembly parts are included.
- The standard power supply is 12 VDC or 24 VAC, please make sure your power supply matches with your camera.
- Make sure all the related equipment is power-off during the installation.
- Check the specification of the products for the installation environment.
- Make sure that the wall is strong enough to withstand four times the weight of the camera and the bracket.

For the camera that supports IR, you are required to pay attention to the following precautions to prevent IR reflection:

- Dust or grease on the bubble will cause IR reflection. If there is dust or grease on the bubble, clean it with clean soft cloth and isopropyl alcohol.
- Make sure that there is no reflective surface too close to the camera lens. The IR light from the camera may reflect back into the lens causing reflection.

### **Notes:**

- Do NOT peel off protective film on bubble and on lens before finishing camera installation.
- Type I camera and type II camera share similar installation steps. We take type I camera as example for demonstration.



## 2.1 Preparation

### *Purpose:*

Before mounting, you have to disassemble the camera and install the memory card first.

### 2.1.1 Disassembling

#### *Steps:*

1. Loosen the three screws on the edge of the bubble with the screw driver.
2. Lift and put aside the bubble to disassemble the camera.

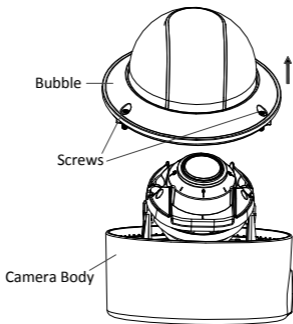


Figure 2-1 Remove the Bubble

## 2.1.2 Memory Card Installation

### Steps:

1. Rotate the camera body to completely expose the memory card slot.
2. Insert the memory card into the memory card slot, and push it to get it mounted.

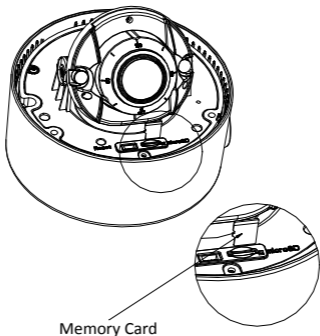


Figure 2-2 Install the Memory Card

3. (Optional) To unmount the memory card, push to eject it.

## 2.2 Mounting

### 2.2.3 Ceiling Mounting

1. Attach the supplied drill template to the place where you want to fix the camera.
2. Drill the screw holes and the cable hole according to the drill template as the figure below.

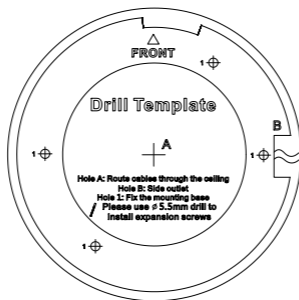


Figure 2-3 Drill Template

#### Notes:

- The drill template varies according to the different camera model.
- (Optional) Routing the cable from the side outlet instead of the cable hole drilled on the ceiling is supported.

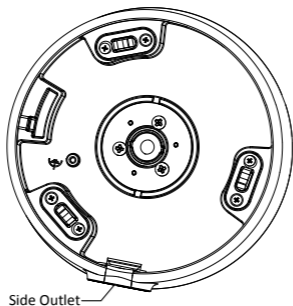


Figure 2-4 Side Outlet

3. Fix the mounting base to the ceiling with the supplied screws.

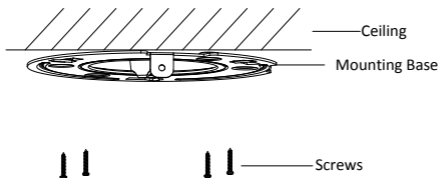


Figure 2-5 Install the Mounting Base

4. Align the camera body with the mounting base and rotate the camera body counterclockwise to get it fitted with the mounting base.

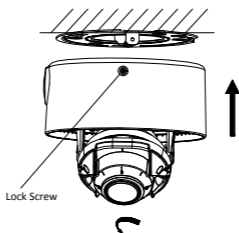


Figure 2-6 Install the Camera Body

5. Connect the video output connector to the monitor and connect the power connector to the power supply to adjust the surveillance angle and image.
6. Adjust the surveillance angle and image according to the figures below.
  - 1). 3-axis Adjustment

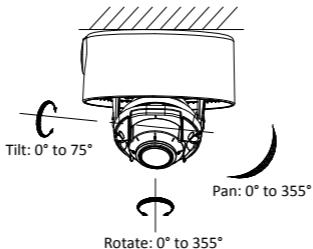


Figure 2-7 3-axis Adjustment

### 2). Zoom and Focus Adjustment

Cameras of this series are equipped with a motor-driven lens. You can adjust the zoom and focus level on PTZ control panel by visiting the camera via web browser or client software.

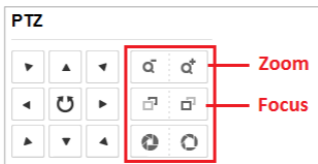


Figure 2-8 Zoom and Focus Adjustment via Web Browser

7. Attach the bubble to the camera body. Fix it with screwdriver to get tightened as the figures below.

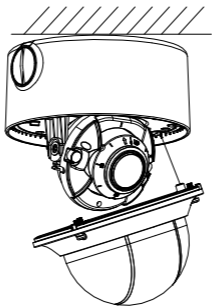


Figure 2-9 Install the Bubble

8. Tighten the lock screw to complete the installation.

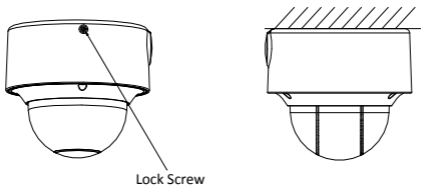


Figure 2-10 Complete the Installation

## 2.2.4 Wall Mounting

### ***Before you start:***

Wall mounting bracket is not included in package. If you choose this mounting type, you have to prepare a bracket first. The wall mounting bracket shown below is only for demonstration.

### ***Note:***

When choosing a wall mounting bracket, you must pay attention to the size of the cap which should match the mounting base of the camera.

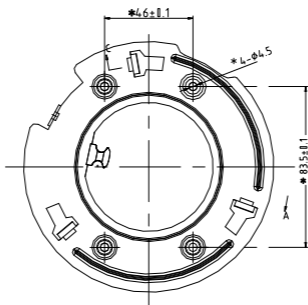


Figure 2-11 Size of the Mounting Base

**Steps:**

1. Route the cables, install the wall mounting bracket, and secure the cap on the bracket.

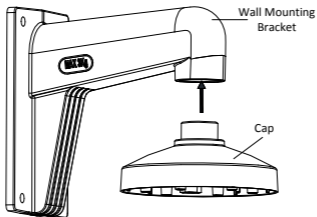


Figure 2-12 Install Wall Mounting Bracket



2. Align the screw holes of the mounting base with the corresponding screw holes of the cap.

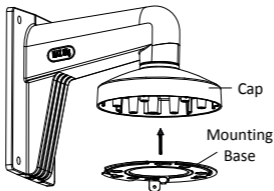


Figure 2-13 Install the Mounting Base

3. Secure the mounting base to the cap with screws.
4. Align the camera with the mounting base, and secure the camera with screws.

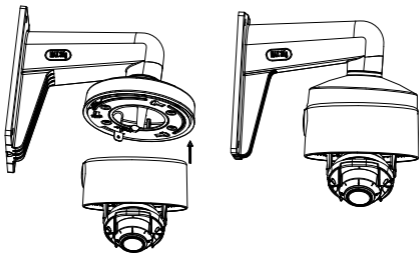


Figure 2-14 Secure the Camera

5. Connect the video output connector to the monitor and connect the power connector to the power supply to adjust the surveillance angle and image.
6. Adjust the image and focus. Please refer to step 6 in section 2.2.3 for more detailed information.
7. Install the bubble back to the camera and tighten the lock screw to complete the installation. Please refer to step 7 and step 8 in section 2.2.3 for more detailed information.

### 2.2.5 Pendant Mounting

#### ***Before you start:***

Pendant mounting bracket is not included in package. If you choose this mounting type, you have to prepare a bracket first. The pendant mounting bracket shown below is only for demonstration.

#### ***Note:***

When choosing a pendant mounting bracket, you must pay attention to the size of the cap which should match the mounting base of the camera.

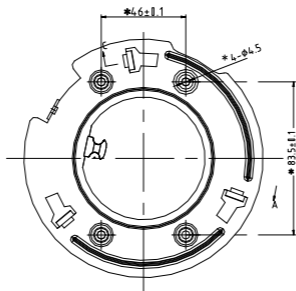


Figure 2-15 Size of the Mounting Base

**Steps:**

1. Route the cables and install the pendant mounting bracket. Secure the cap on the bracket.

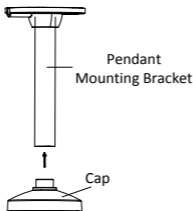


Figure 2-16 Install the Pendant Mounting Bracket

2. Align the screw holes of the mounting base with the corresponding screw holes of the cap.

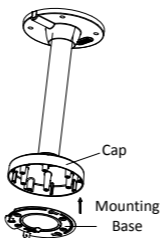


Figure 2-17 Install the Mounting Base

3. Secure the mounting base to the cap with screws.
4. Align the camera with the mounting base, and secure the camera with screws.

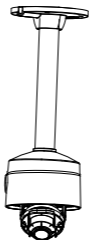


Figure 2-18 Secure the Camera

5. Connect the video output connector to the monitor and connect the power connector to the power supply to adjust the surveillance angle and image.
6. Adjust the image and focus. Please refer to step 6 in section 2.2.3 for more detailed information.
7. Install the bubble back to the camera and tighten the lock screw to complete the installation. Please refer to step 7 and step 8 in section 2.2.3 for more detailed information.

## 2.3 Installation of Network Cable Water-proof Jacket (Optional)

### *Purpose:*

If the camera is installed outdoor, you can adapt the water-proof accessory for the network cable after the camera is secured on the installation surface.

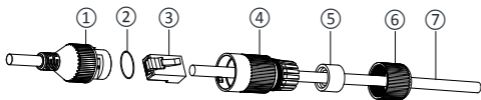


Figure 2-19 Water-proof Accessory Components

### Steps:

1. Feed the plugless network cable (7) through the lock nut (6), waterproof rubber gasket (5) (the rubber gasket inset ridge must face the waterproof endcap), and the waterproof endcap (4) in order.
2. Crimp an RJ-45 network plug (3) onto the end of the cable, taking care to insert the twisted pairs of wires in correct order.
3. Place the O-type gasket (2) onto the end of the camera's network interface socket (1).
4. Insert the network plug (3) into the camera's network interface socket (1).
5. Insert the waterproof rubber gasket (5) into the waterproof endcap (4), and secure lock nut (6) with the waterproof endcap (4).
6. Align the snap on the waterproof endcap (4) with the notch on the camera's network interface socket (1), and then secure the

waterproof endcap ④ to the camera's network interface socket ① to finish installation.

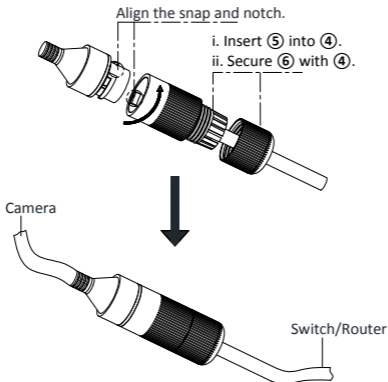


Figure 2-20 Water-proof Accessory Installation

## 2.4 Installation of Water-proof Tape (Optional)

### **Purpose:**

If the camera is installed outdoor, you can use supplied water-proof tape to protect cable connectors and unused cables after the camera is secured on the installation surface.

### **Steps:**

1. Tear off the yellow release paper on the back of the water-proof tape.
2. Stretch the water-proof tape to reach twice the initial length.

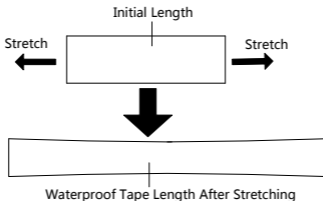


Figure 2-21 Stretch the Water-proof Tape

3. Wrap the water-proof tape around the cable connector tightly as the figure below.

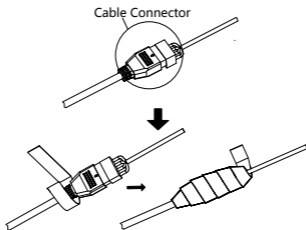


Figure 2-22 Wrap the Water-proof Tape

**Note:**

Make sure that all naked wires are all firmly wrapped in the water-proof tape.



4. Press the tape on both ends of the connector to make sure no water can get in as the figure below.

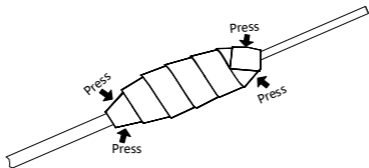


Figure 2-23 Press the Water-proof Tape

5. Wrap the water-proof tape around the remaining unused cables tightly as the figure below.

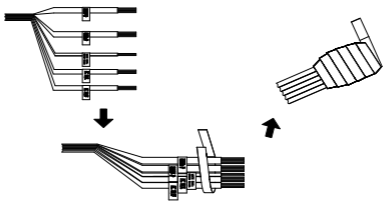


Figure 2-24 Wrap the Water-proof Tape

**Note:**

Make sure that all naked wires are all firmly wrapped in the water-proof tape.

6. Press the tape to make sure no water can get in as the figure below.

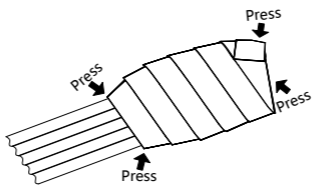


Figure 2-25 Press the Water-proof Tape

## 3 Setting the Network Camera over the LAN

### Note:

You shall acknowledge that the use of the product with Internet access might be under network security risks. For avoidance of any network attacks and information leakage, please strengthen your own protection.

If the product does not work properly, contact your dealer or the nearest service center for help.

### 3.1 Wiring

Connect the camera to network according to the following figures.

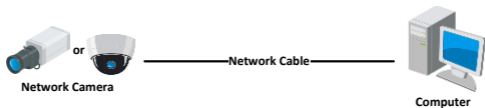


Figure 3-1 Connecting Directly

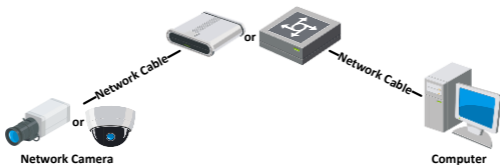


Figure 3-2 Connecting via a Switch or a Router

## 3.2 Activating the Camera

You are required to activate the camera first by setting a strong password for it before you can use the camera.

Activation via Web Browser, Activation via SADP, and Activation via Client Software are all supported. We will take activation via SADP software and Activation via Web Browser as examples to introduce the camera activation.

**Note:**

Refer to the User Manual of Network Camera for Activation via Client Software.

### 3.2.1 Activation via Web Browser

**Steps:**

1. Power on the camera. Connect the camera to your computer or the switch/router which your computer connects to.
2. Input the IP address into the address bar of the web browser, and press Enter to enter the activation interface.

**Notes:**

- The default IP address of the camera is 192.168.1.64.
- The computer and the camera should belong to the same subnet.
- For the camera enables the DHCP by default, you need to use the SADP software to search the IP address.

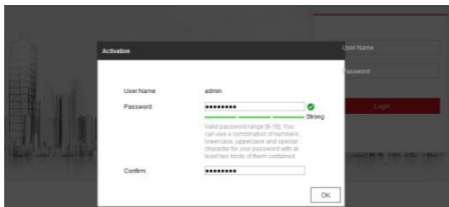


Figure 3-3 Activation Interface(Web)

3. Create a password and input the password into the password field.



**STRONG PASSWORD RECOMMENDED**– *We highly recommend you create a strong password of your own choosing (using a minimum of 8 characters, including upper case letters, lower case letters, numbers, and special characters) in order to increase the security of your product. And we recommend you reset your password regularly, especially in the high security system, resetting the password monthly or weekly can better protect your product.*

4. Confirm the password.
5. Click **OK** to save the password and enter the live view interface.

### 3.2.2 Activation via SADP Software

SADP software is used for detecting the online device, activating the camera, and resetting the password.





**STRONG PASSWORD RECOMMENDED**– *We highly recommend you create a strong password of your own choosing (using a minimum of 8 characters, including upper case letters, lower case letters, numbers, and special characters) in order to increase the security of your product. And we recommend you reset your password regularly, especially in the high security system, resetting the password monthly or weekly can better protect your product.*

**Note:**

You can enable the Hik-Connect service for the device during activation. Refer to Chapter 5.1 for detailed information.

4. Click **Activate** to start activation.

You can check whether the activation is completed on the popup window. If activation failed, make sure that the password meets the requirement and try again.

### 3.3 Modifying the IP Address

**Purpose:**

To view and configure the camera via LAN (Local Area Network), you need to connect the network camera in the same subnet with your PC.

Use the SADP software or client software to search and change the IP address of the device. We take modifying the IP Address via SADP software as an example to introduce the IP address modification.

For IP address modification via client software, refer to the user manual of client software.

### Steps:

1. Run the SADP software.
2. Select an active device.
3. Change the device IP address to the same subnet with your computer by either modifying the IP address manually or checking the checkbox of Enable DHCP.

4. Input the admin password and click **Modify** to activate your IP address modification.

The batch IP address modification is supported by the SADP. Refer to the user manual of SADP for details.

## 4 Accessing via Web Browser

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### **System Requirement:**

Operating System: Microsoft Windows XP SP1 and above version

CPU: 2.0 GHz or higher

RAM: 1G or higher

Display: 1024×768 resolution or higher

Web Browser: Internet Explorer 8.0 and above version, Apple Safari 5.0.2 and above version, Mozilla Firefox 5.0 and above version and Google Chrome 18 and above version

### **Steps:**

1. Open the web browser.
2. In the browser address bar, input the IP address of the network camera, and press the **Enter** key to enter the login interface.

#### **Note:**

- The default IP address is 192.168.1.64. You are recommended to change the IP address to the same subnet with your computer.

3. Input the user name and password.

The admin user should configure the device accounts and user/operator permissions properly. Delete the unnecessary accounts and user/operator permissions.

#### **Note:**

The device IP address gets locked if the admin user performs 7 failed password attempts (5 attempts for the user/operator).

### 4. Click **Login**.

### 5. Install the plug-in before viewing the live video and managing the camera. Follow the installation prompts to install the plug-in.

You may have to close the web browser to finish the installation of the plug-in.

## 5 Operating via Hik-Connect App

---

### *Purpose:*

Hik-Connect is an application for mobile devices. With the App, you can view live image of the camera, receive alarm notification and so on.

### *Note:*

Hik-Connect service is not supported by certain camera models.

### 5.1 Enable Hik-Connect Service on Camera

#### *Purpose:*

Hik-Connect service should be enabled on your camera before using the service.

You can enable the service through SADP software or web browser.

#### 5.1.1 Enable Hik-Connect Service via SADP Software

##### *Steps:*

1. Check the checkbox of **Enable Hik-Connect** on:
  - 1). "Activate the Device" page during camera activation, refer to Chapter 3.2.2.
  - 2). Or "Modify Network Parameters" page during modifying IP address, refer to Chapter 3.3.
2. Create a verification code or change the verification code.

3. Select Platform Access Mode as Hik-Connect.
4. Check the checkbox of Enable.
5. Click and read "Terms of Service" and "Privacy Policy" in pop-up window.
6. Create a verification code or change the verification code for the camera.

### Note:

The verification code is required when you add the camera to Hik-Connect app.

7. Save the settings.

## 5.2 Hik-Connect Setup

### Steps:

1. Download and install the Hik-Connect app by searching “Hik-Connect” in App Store or Google Play™.
2. Launch the app and register for a Hik-Connect user account.
3. Log in Hik-Connect app after registration.

## 5.3 Adding Camera to Hik-Connect

### Before you start:

You need to enable the Hik-Connect service on camera before adding it to your Hik-Connect account. Refer to Chapter 5.1.

### Steps:

1. Use a network cable to connect the camera with a router if the camera does not support Wi-Fi.

### Note:

After the camera connects to the network, please wait one minute before any operation on the camera using Hik-Connect app.

2. In the Hik-Connect app, tap “+” on the upper-right corner and then scan the QR code of the camera to add the camera.

You can find the QR code on the camera or on the cover of the Quick Start Guide of the camera in the package.

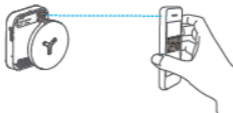



Figure 5-4 Scan QR Code

**Note:**

If the QR code is missing or too blur to be recognized, you can also add the camera by tapping the  icon and inputting the camera's serial number.

3. Input the verification code of your camera.

**Note:**

- The required verification code is the code you create or change when you enabling Hik-Connect service on camera.
- If you forget the verification code, you can check the current verification code on **Platform Access** configuration page via web browser.

4. Follow the prompts to set the network connection and add the camera to your Hik-Connect account.

## 5.4 Initializing the Memory Card

***Steps:***

Check the memory card status by tapping on the Storage Status in the Device Settings interface.

If the memory card status displays as Uninitialized, tap to initialize it. The status will then change to Normal. You can then start recording any event triggered video in the camera such as motion detection.



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
